

PHILIPPINES SUPER TYPHOON MANGKHUT

Emergency Response

In the early morning of September 15, 2018, Typhoon Mangkhut made landfall in Baggao, Cagayan, with the equivalent of a Category 5 storm, causing widespread flooding and multiple landslides.

International Medical Corps supported more than 90,000 women, men, and children with access to healthcare, clean water, sanitation and hygiene care in Benguet Province.

We supported more than **80,000 people** with clean water access



We provided four health facilities with alternate power sources, reaching **65,000 community members**



We reached **4,051 community members** through hygiene promotion



We trained **777 people** in emergency response management and surged medical support, and **206 community** health workers to identify clean water sources



We supported vaccinations for **250 children** across Benguet province



Following Typhoon Manghkut, there was a 1,000% increase in measles cases in Benguet Province alone, with 34,000+ cases across the Philippines. International Medical Corps partnered with the Department of Health to combat the outbreak. Together, we supported the provision of 1,825 measles and Japanese encephalitis vaccinations.
