

UPDATES TO THE **BUILDING A BETTER RESPONSE** ONLINE COURSE

We are pleased to announce the latest updates to the Building a Better Response (BBR) online course: the translation of the newest e-learning unit --Unit 6: Complex Humanitarian Emergencies – into Arabic and French. The unit describes complex humanitarian emergencies, elements of coordination among humanitarian actors during such crises, and the challenges in responding to a complex humanitarian emergency.

The new unit complements the 5 units already available on the international humanitarian coordination system, which are also available in Arabic, English, and French. Since its launch in 2014, the BBR e-learning has been accessed by over 40,000 humanitarian professionals from over 190 countries.

Additionally, the entire e-learning has been updated to reflect recent developments within the international humanitarian response community.

The BBR e-learning course aims to build the knowledge of NGO workers and other humanitarian actors in the international coordination system for large-scale emergencies, humanitarian leadership, basics of humanitarian funding and planning, and other areas of importance to humanitarian response.

Learners who successfully complete the online course will be granted a certificate from the Humanitarian Academy at Harvard.

We encourage NGO staff, as well as other humanitarian actors, who are engaged in humanitarian response, or who may benefit from increased knowledge in order to be better prepared for future emergencies, to take this course. Together, we can improve our coordination capacity and better respond to the needs of affected populations.
