

#### Nurse Midwife (national)

You and the doctor saw Mary within 72 hours of the rape and provided perfect clinical management, including forensic evidence collection (photographs and documentation of injuries and observations). You have compiled a complete and thorough written report and you want to forward this report to the police for investigation and arrest. You are proud that finally the health centre provided this excellent service to the survivor – and you desperately want your hard work to contribute to obtaining justice for Mary, who has suffered so much. **You are pushing everyone in this meeting to get the survivor to agree to take her case to the police.** You know that your medical evidence will support a prosecution and conviction – you have no doubts about this.

#### GBV Case Worker (national)

You have been working closely with Mary, giving her information and supporting her as she makes her own decisions about services and assistance. You were the one who accompanied Mary to the health centre within 72 hours of the rape. You have been comforting Mary while executing her care plan, and you believe that Mary is afraid of the perpetrator, and afraid of others in the community learning what happened to her. **You do not want to discuss police reporting with Mary as you believe it will be too traumatic for her and will frighten her;** you think that even bringing up the issue of police involvement will cause Mary to mistrust you. You are pushing everyone to not discuss police reporting with Mary **as you know better than anyone in this meeting what Mary wants and what she deserves.** You have had some bad experiences in the past with other cases with some of the actors here not listening to survivors. You know that **you must fight for Mary's rights and keep her away from the security and legal sectors.**

The Protection Officer has learned about Mary's case and has asked you to refer her for protection and legal assistance. The nurse midwife is also asking for updates about this case. You asked Mary if you could organize a case management meeting with these actors, along with the Community Health Worker who first referred Mary to you, and Mary has agreed. You will lead this meeting and ask others to leave Mary alone.

#### Protection Officer (national)

You have not yet spoken directly with Mary but you have come to know about this case and have seen the Medical Report (an excellent and thorough report that includes photographs of injuries and excellent documentation of observations and injuries). You have been working closely with the local police and judiciary for two months now to gain their trust and engage them in understanding more about protection concerns, including GBV. You have arranged for GBV training starting next week for police and justice actors and you are certain it will be very good training with good results. **You plan to meet with Mary and help her make a police report about the rape. You are a national lawyer, so you are familiar with the systems and processes,** where others involved with Mary's case do not have this experience. **You know that reporting to the police right thing to do, because the community must be protected from perpetrators.** You also feel sure that Mary will be fine through the legal process – especially with the GBV Case Worker continuing to provide emotional support. This is the way multi-sectoral response is supposed to work.

Community Health Worker (national)

You and Mary live in the same community. Mary first disclosed her rape experience to you at the end of a community education session. You asked her if she wanted to get some help, she said yes, and you took her to the GBV Case Worker because you know that is the main referral point for GBV cases. **You know more about the incident than anyone else in the room because Mary told you the whole story – and has not yet shared all of the details with anyone else.** You have very little experience with GBV cases – all you know is you should refer to the “experts” if the survivor agrees, which is what you did. You are very concerned about Mary; this is the first time you heard such a horrible story. All you want is for Mary to feel better, recover, and resume her life. **During this meeting, you understand the experts will be making decisions.**
